

- · Communication through weekly newsletters, emails, new brochure to teachers


OCPL Workshops

- Master teachers supporting perpetual learning


What is the structure?

Workshop Template- excerpt

Workshop Description:

Participants will examine research based comprehension strategies appropriate for their developmental level and apply those strategies to digital texts accessed on the web via a computer or Chromebook, via iBooks on the iPad and texts on the app, Open eBooks. Instructional strategies for building students' annotation skills on paper from digital text will also be part of this hands on workshop.

ELA standards for Reading Literature, Reading Informational as well as technology infused writing and speaking and listening standards will be examined and utilized in the application process.

Workshop Goals/Objectives:

Participants will deepen their understanding of the components of balanced literacy with a specific focus on comprehension strategies for students to use while accessing digital text.

Resources and ways of accessing digital text are a critical component of the hands on element of the workshop. Student Impact:

Students will know and be able to access digital text on an iPad or a computer and employ specific strategies for comprehension development that work well for them as a learner (metacognition) and annotate their thinking on paper.

Students will be able to craft digital written responses to text from paper based annotations. Participant Commitment 5 total hours

1 face to face 2 hour session - 1 Digital follow up to share out classroom usage (2 hours planning & implementation, 1 hour online sharing)






Professional Learning for Focused Instructional Coaches
