Of the federal grants referenced, most allocations for Worcester decreased in funding from FY 18 to FY19. The only one received by the district with a significant increase was Title IV, which went from \$298,253 to \$863,317. The increase allowed additional amounts to be budgeted to previously funded activities that promote safe and healthy schools, improving the use of technology, and well-rounded educational opportunities. Slightly more than half of the increase has been budgeted for after school and out-of-school time programming previously funded under Title I. (Title I decreased by \$266,318 from FY18 to FY19.)
