**Math:** Students will continue to solve algebraic equations and inequalities. Students will graph inequalities on a number line. They will understand dependent and independent variables that are represented in equations, tables and graphs.

**Science:** Students will learn about cells; structures and purposes, unicellular and multicellular organisms. They will learn how to use a microscope to view cells under magnification. Students should be in the planning process of their Science Fair projects, if not already starting to collect data (depending on the type of project). Science Fair projects are due March 5th.

**ELA:** Students will continue with historical nonfiction, *Children of the Dust Bowl: The True Story of the School at Weedpatch Camp*. They have been collecting, interpreting and applying information through reading, discussion, and writing. This unit of study ends with a research paper which will be completed in class. After February vacation students will once again work in book clubs. Our writing focus will then shift to narrative, but students will continue to write for a variety of purposes. Look for a bit more homework as we approach the spring. I will be sending home weekly articles and question sets which will be given out on Monday and due on Thursday. Please encourage your child to read 30 minutes each night and keep up with their reading log.

**History & Social Science:** Students will learn about the history, politics, geography, culture, economics, and social structures in Eastern Europe. Their final project will be a Google Slides Trip Brochure. This project will be due on 2/12, and presentations will begin. After February break we will begin to study Asia.
