Grade 8 US Government and Civics Textbook Pilot Summary Report

3/12/19

In June 2018 the Massachusetts Department of Education adopted new History and Social Science Frameworks. The Worcester Public Schools developed a three year roll out plan to implement the new framework standards, beginning with Grade 8 US Government and Civics for the 2018-19 school year.

To support curriculum alignment to the new standards, the district piloted new texts and online resources during the 2018-2019 school year. During the pilot process, teachers and students utilized hard copy textbooks, online textbooks, reading supplements and additional online materials. Teachers explored the ease of accessing online resources, integration with Clever, Chromebooks and Google and alignment to the Massachusetts Framework Standards. All piloting teachers received professional development/training on the materials as well as varying levels of support from the vendors throughout the school year.

In addition to feedback from the piloting history teachers, the district sought feedback from district IT specialists, Focused Instructional Technology Coaches, Focused Instructional Coaches, Special Education teachers, Alternative School teachers, and Title III EL Implementation Coach and ELL teachers.
