#### Two-part After School Program

**1. Focused academic tutoring** tailored to the specific needs of individual students, to include student-centered remedial activities to help support their success in math classes. Activities will range from one-on-one help to hands-on activities and small projects. Topics will include, but are not limited to Numeric Operations, Algebra, Geometry and Probability.

**2. Math Club** with different emphasis/topics to reinforce math concepts and open students' interest in exploring Math beyond the 4 walls of the classroom in a fun way. Monthly themes to include Math Passtime, Math Mysteries, RealLife Applications to Math and Art with Math

### **SHINE/Mindmatters**

All Secondary schools/locations have been offered funding for MindMatters teams, which support wellness and promote mental health. Currently schools meet 1-2 times/month afterschool to provide students opportunities to work together to message this school wide.

### **Afterschool counseling:**

Currently 6 schools offer afterschool group and individual counseling through partnerships with local agencies.
