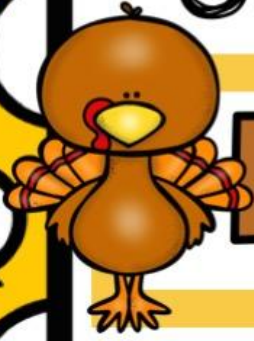

Look What We Are Learning!

In MATH we are learning strategies to multiply two and three-digit numbers by a one-digit number. Once students are feeling comfortable with this, we will work on multiplying four-digit numbers by a one-digit number. The children are starting to see the importance of knowing their facts. They are realizing that if they know their facts, multiplication of multi-digit numbers will be easier for them. Please continue to have your children practice their math facts at home.

In SCIENCE we will continue to study fast changes to Earth's surface that usually occur during natural disasters such as but not limited to severe storms, earthquakes, and volcanoes!

In ELA, we are studying informational texts to practice the skills of identifying the differences between Fact and Opinion and finding the Author's Purpose. In grammar, we have been reviewing sentence parts and learning about different kinds of sentences. Next will be nouns: common, proper, singular, plural, irregular plurals and invisible nouns. In Writing we are learning to TTAGG, figuring out The GIST and using sensory details to write a setting so descriptive the reader feels like she is right there!

In SOCIAL STUDIES we are talking about climate change, pollution and conservation.
