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Look What We Are Learning!

Math: At the end of February we began learning how to solve long division problems. Students have been solving them using the traditional algorithm as well as the box method. We will continue to practice long division as we begin to study fractions. In our fraction unit, we will relate them to decimals. Students will express a fraction with denominator 10 as an equivalent fraction with denominator 100, and use this technique to add two fractions with respective denominators 10 and 100. They will also use decimal notation for fractions with denominators 10 or 100. Lastly, we will compare two decimals to hundredths by reasoning about their size and recognize that comparisons are valid only when the two decimals refer to the same whole. Record the results of comparisons with the symbols >, =, or <. Science: We will continue to study and make observations to show that energy can be transferred from place to place by sound, light, heat, and electric currents.

<u>ELA:</u> This month, our focus is on Writing and getting ready for our ELA MCAS. We will continue to use the TIDE organizer and all our other other strategies while we strengthen our writing stamina. In addition to constructed responses, we will also be working on Narratives.
