Look What We Are Learning!

Math: When we returned from winter break we started where we left off with multiplying 2-digit by 2-digit numbers. It is important that the students continue to practice learning their multiplication facts at home because all charts have been taken down and students are expected to know their facts. Please take some time to help your child practice their multiplication facts.

Science: We have begun to explore energy. Students will investigate how energy is stored, how it can make objects move, and how collisions transfer energy between objects.

ELA: We will continue to work on our Writing goals of finding the *best* evidence in a text and then interpreting it, the DO WHAT?!, The GIST, and using TTAGG as we practice more TIDE pieces.
