

- Try their best!



<u>Math</u>

Students have also been exploring 2 and 3-dimensional shapes. We have been discussing quadrilaterals and discussing whether or not a shape is considered a quadrilateral.

ELA - Reading, Writing, Phonics

Throughout the month students will take part in a novel study. We will read The Chocolate Touch. This book is quite entertaining and teaches a life lesson. I believe that the students will enjoy reading it. While reading we will continue to work on character traits, messages, story elements, and problem/solution. We will also compare it to the original story King Midas that The Chocolate Touch is based on.

Writing-Much of our writing this month will focus on our novel study. Students will complete a writing response each day after reading. They will answer comprehension questions about the story. Students will share ideas while we are reading, they will then put their ideas into their Reading Response Journal.

Phonics- We will continue to explore various long vowel sounds.

Science/Social Studies

Science- Students will discover how plants reproduce by exploring the process of pollination and fruiting.

Social Studies- Students will read and learn about why many colonists thought the British government treated them unfairly, and why they protested new British laws and taxes.
