


December News Mrs. Palumbo

Math

Throughout the month students will focus on applying strategies to achieve fluency with multiplication and division facts within 100. Students will also continue to work on solving number stories that involve multiplication and division.

Students will also work on solving to find the area of a shape. Students will work on understanding how area is related to multiplication and addition. We will explore breaking an irregular shape into smaller parts to solve for area.

We have been learning multiplication facts for factors 0-12. Students participate in Xtra Math and daily games and practice to work on accuracy and fluency. Please encourage your child to practice their math facts at night. Even 10 minutes a night with flash cards will improve fluency and confidence!

ELA

Throughout the month we will continue to learn about the Ancient Roman Empire. We are learning about their beliefs, culture, government and overall way of life.
